What Do the Items on the POW/MIA Table Represent?



"Those who have served, and those currently serving in the uniformed services of the United States, are ever mindful that the sweetness of enduring peace has always been tainted by the bitterness of personal sacrifice. We are compelled to never forget that while we enjoy our daily pleasures, there are others who have endured and may still be enduring the agonies of pain, deprivation and imprisonment."

Meaning of the symbols:

The small table is set for one. It symbolizes the members who are missing from our midst. They are commonly called POWs or MIAs; they are "comrades." They are unable to be here and so we remember them.

The table is smaller than the others, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone against his oppressors.

The tablecloth is white, representing the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms.

The empty chair depicts an unknown face, representing no specific Soldier, Sailor, Marine or Airman, but all who are not here with us.

The table is round to show that our concern for them is never ending.

The Bible represents faith in a higher power and the pledge to our country, founded as one nation under God.

A black chair cover with white insignias and lettering reminds all POWs/MIAs "You are not forgotten."

The black napkin stands for the emptiness these warriors have left in the hearts of their families and friends

The single red rose reminds us of their families and loved ones, and the red ribbon represents the love of country, which inspired them to answer the nation's call.

The candle is reminiscent of the light of everlasting hope, which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their captors to the open arms of a grateful nation.

The candle is lit to symbolize the upward reach of their unconquerable spirit.

The slices of lemon on the plate remind us of their bitter fate.

The salt upon the plate represents the tears of their families.

The wine glass turned upside down reminds us that our distinguished comrades cannot be with us to drink a toast or join in the festivities.

According to the U.S. Department of Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, there are about 81,600 Americans missing — from the battlefields of World War II to recent conflicts. About 75% of those are in the Indo-Pacific region. About 41,000 of the 81,600 missing are presumed lost at sea.

Let us be ever mindful of those American service men and women who are no longer able to participate in these events. Let us be especially mindful of the continuing pain, sorrow, and sacrifice of our comrades-in-arms who bear the title of Prisoner of War or Missing in Action whose story remains unfinished. Let us remember.

November 19, 1863 – President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address during ceremonies dedicating 17 acres of the Gettysburg Battlefield as a National Cemetery. Famed orator Edward Everett of Massachusetts preceded Lincoln and spoke for two hours. Lincoln then delivered his address in less than two minutes. Although many in attendance were at first unimpressed, Lincoln's words have come to symbolize the definition of democracy itself.

November 21, 1920 - The IRA (Irish Republican Army) shot and killed 14 British soldiers in Dublin in what became known as "Bloody Sunday."

November 22, 1963 - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Dallas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. The President was struck in the back, then in the head. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38

p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

November 26, 1789 - The first American holiday occurred, proclaimed by President George Washington to be Thanksgiving Day, a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for the successful establishment of the new American republic.
