### FROM THE SR VICE-COMMANDER



On December 1, 2023, Arizona, America and the world lost a wonderful person Sandra Day O'Connor. She was the first woman to serve as a United States Supreme Court Associate Justice, but she



was so much more than that. She wasn't aloft, she was a kind caring person who didn't consider her prestigious position made her better than others. Justice O'

Connor had time to converse with you and you could tell she cared.

The photo on the left was taken upon the dedication of Sandra Day O'Connor High School in north Phoenix. She was at the school to speak, and my squad had the privilege to provide security. Justice O'Connor took the time to talk with us and pose for this photo, which I cherish, and have a copy of on my desk. That was the only time I personally met her but since she was from Arizona, she frequently spent time here. I have read posts from another Phoenix Police Officer who provided security for her describing her kindness and unpretentiousness.

When she was at Sky Harbor Airport waiting for a plane, she would ask to be taken to the employee breakroom where she would talk with the airport employees and others.

Justice O'Connor grew up on a large family ranch near Duncan, Arizona. She attended Stanford University where she graduated with undergraduate degree and then a law degree. After graduation, she couldn't find a job in a law firm even though she graduated third in her class, as law firms were only hiring males at that time. She traveled to Germany with her husband who was an Army lawyer and she worked as a civilian lawyer there. Upon returning to the U.S., she started a law firm in Phoenix. From 1965 to 1969, she served as an Arizona Assistant Attorney General. In 1969, she was elected to the Arizona State Senate where she served until 1974. She was then elected to the Arizona Superior Court, and she was later appointed to the Arizona Court of Appeals. In 1981 U.S., Senators Dennis DeConcini and Barry Goldwater (AZ) recommended Justice O'Connor to President Ronald Reagan to fill a vacancy on the U.S. Supreme Court. Justice O'Connor served on the U.S. Supreme Court from 1981-2006 when she resigned to become a caregiver for her husband, John Jay O' Connor who was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. She cared for him until his death over two decades later.

Justice O' Connor was a brilliant, extremely accomplished woman, but more important than that, she was a caring woman who cared for her family, her State, her Country and all people. Rest in Peace Your Honor.

Starting July 1 of the current year and ending June 30 of the following year. For the 2024 membership dues, that means July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. Again, please pay your dues. **December 6, 1877** - At his laboratory in West Orange, New Jersey, Thomas Edison spoke the children's verse "Mary had a Little Lamb..." while demonstrating his newly invented phonograph which utilized a revolving cylinder wrapped in tinfoil to record sounds.

**December 6, 1917** - Two ships collided at Halifax, Nova Scotia, resulting in an explosion that killed more than 1,500 persons and injured 8,000. The Norwegian ship *Imo* collided with the French munitions ship *Mont Blanc* which was loaded with supplies for the war in Europe, including 5,000 tons of TNT. A tidal wave caused by the explosion destroyed much of the city.

**December 6, 1921** - The Irish Free State became an independent member of the British Commonwealth.

**Thursday December 7** – 1600 Post 96 Officer's Meeting at AZ Traditions Classroom.

**December 7, 1941 -** The U.S. Naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, was attacked by nearly 200 Japanese aircraft in a raid that lasted just over one hour and left nearly 3,000 Americans dead.

**Thursday December 7** - Hanukkah begins at nightfall. Hanukkah is a Jewish festival that reaffirms the ideals of Judaism and commemorates in particular the rededication of the Second Temple of Jerusalem by the lighting of candles on each day of the festival. Although not mentioned in the Hebrew Scriptures, Hanukkah came to be widely celebrated and remains one of the most popular Jewish religious observances.

**December 8, 1991 -** The USSR (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) ceased to exist, as the leaders of Russia, Byelorussia and the Ukraine signed an agreement creating the Commonwealth of Independent States. The remaining republics of the former USSR, with the exception of Georgia, joined the new Commonwealth.

**Friday December 8** - Immaculate Conception of Mary

Commemorating Pearl Harbor: "A Date Which Will Live In Infamy"

This is a personal story from U.S. Navy veteran Ed Miklavic about that fateful day on Dec. 7, 1942. Ed will place the Pearl Harbor Survivors wreath at the Commemorating Pearl Harbor Day Ceremony hosted by Honoring America's Veterans at noon on Dec. 9 at Wesley Bolin Plaza.

Friday December 15 - Hanukkah ends at nightfall.

**Saturday December 16** – 0900 NWVVA meeting Sunland Memorial Park.

**Sunday December 17** - 1000 Marty Schwab Memorial Breakfast at Richi's Diner, Bell & Reems. All veterans and family are invited to this informal gathering.

**December 17, 1777** - At Valley Forge in Pennsylvania, the Continental Army led by General George Washington settled in for the winter.

**December 18, 2019** - Donald Trump, the 45<sup>th</sup> U.S. President, was impeached by the House of Representatives on charges of Abuse of Power and Obstruction of Congress. The charges alleged that Trump sought help from Ukraine to investigate Democratic rival Joe Biden and his son Hunter Biden, to interfere with the 2020 presidential election, and that Trump attempted to obstruct the House's impeachment inquiry by directing his aides to ignore subpoenas for documents and testimony. Trump was acquitted on February 5, 2020 when the U.S. Senate failed to reach the two-thirds majority needed for conviction.

**December 19, 1946** - War broke out in French Indochina as Ho Chi Minh attacked the French seeking to oust them from Vietnam. This marked the beginning of a thirty-year conflict, which eventually led to heavy U.S. involvement and ended with a Communist victory in April 1975 after U.S. withdrawal from South Vietnam.

**Friday December 21** – Winter Solstice, winter begins in the Northern Hemisphere. In the Southern Hemisphere today is the beginning of summer.

**Monday December 25** – Christmas Day, commemorating the birth of Jesus of Nazareth. Although the exact date of his birth is not known, it has been celebrated on December 25 by the Western (Roman Catholic) Church since 336 A.D.

**December 26** - Boxing Day in the United Kingdom and many other countries, a day of gift giving when boxes of food, clothing and other gifts are traditionally given to employees, tradespeople and other service providers.

**December 28, 1947** - Victor Emmanuel III, the last King of Italy, died while in exile in Alexandria, Egypt. He had become king upon the assassination of his father in 1900. Following World War I, he named Benito Mussolini to form a cabinet and then failed to prevent Mussolini's Fascists from seizing power. In 1946, he abdicated and went into exile.

**December 30, 1922** - The USSR (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) was established through the confederation of Russia, Byelorussia, Ukraine and the Transcaucasian Federation.

**December 31** - New Year's Eve, the final evening of the Gregorian calendar year, traditionally a night for merrymaking to welcome in the New Year. If you party, drive sober and safe.


On the way out of the church one Sunday morning, the preacher grabbed Jack by the hand and pulled him aside.

Jack replied, "I'm already in the Army of the Lord, Pastor."


Pastor questioned, "How come I almost never see you except at Christmas and Easter?"




