Post 96 makes a monthly contribution to MANA House, which provides shelter and support to get homeless veterans off the streets.

Post 96 supports Americanism by sponsoring boys at Boys' State where they can learn how the American government is supposed to function. None of these things happen without the support of the members of our Post. Especially those members who assist with our fund-raising activities. Another way Post 96 supports Americanism is through the retirement of unserviceable American Flags. Post 96 is a member organization of North West Valley Veterans Association. As a member organization, some of our members take turns with other member veterans' organizations in retiring flags by cremation. Together with these same fellow veterans' organizations, we organize and conduct Memorial Day and Veterans Day observances programs.

In 2023 and prior years Post 96 Legion Riders have conducted fund raisers to send youth to ALLECA (AMERICAN LEGION LAW ENFORCEMENT CAREER Academy – ARIZONA) and provide support to other worthwhile veteran causes.

A few members try very hard to make this work succeed. What is needed is more effort, more support, and more dedication from the other approximately 95% of our membership.

- Make 2024 your year of involvement.
- Plan to be a part of your Post and its activities.
- Attend the monthly meetings and provide morale support for each other.

#### **MEMBERSHIP REPORT**

We are nearing the end of 2023. Dues for 2024 will be late after December 31, so please get your dues paid. Best way to pay them is online at MyLegion.org. Membership is on a fiscal calendar. Starting July 1 of the current year and ending June 30 of the following year. For the 2024 membership dues, that means July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. Again, please pay your dues. Our membership is 183, but only 120 have paid for 2024. That is only 65.57 percent that have paid. We would like to see 100 percent. There are Posts that have met or exceeded 100 percent because their members paid and/or their recruited more.

As of January 1, we have 44 pay the post, 41 pay

online and 35 PUFL's. Total is 120. Our goal is 183 so we have 65.57% paid! Keep those cards and letters coming; don't forget your \$40 check. Thanks to all who paid their dues. It is easy to pay online. If you use a credit card, we don't mail your membership card because you can print your own online. But if you want one, let George know and he will mail it to you.

**Monday January 1 - New Year's Day -** The most celebrated holiday around the world.

**January 1, 1801** - Ireland was added to Great Britain by an Act of Union thus creating the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

**January 1, 1863** – The Emancipation Proclamation by President Abraham Lincoln freed the slaves in the states rebelling against the Union.

January 5, 1919 - The German Workers' Party (*Deutsche Arbeiterpartei*) was founded by Anton Drexler in Munich. Adolf Hitler became member No. 7 and changed the name in April of 1920 to the National Socialist German Workers' Party (*Nationalsozialistische Deutsche Arbeiterpartei*) commonly shortened to Nazi or Nazi Party.

**January 22, 1943** - During World War II in the Pacific, Japanese resistance ended in New Guinea, resulting in the first land victory of the war for Allied forces.

**January 24, 1848** - The California gold rush began with the accidental discovery of the precious metal near Coloma during construction of a Sutter's sawmill. An announcement by President Polk later in the year caused a national sensation and resulted in a flood of "Fortyniners" seeking wealth.

January 27, 1943 - The U.S. 8th Air Force conducted the first all-American bombing raid on Germany as 55 bombers targeted Wilhelmshaven, losing three planes while claiming to have shot down 22 German fighters. The success of this first mission encouraged U.S. military planners to begin regular daylight bombing raids, which eventually resulted in high casualty rates for the American crew members involved.

**January 28, 1915** - The U.S. Coast Guard was created by an Act of Congress, combining the Life Saving Service and the Revenue Cutter Service.

## 2024 Will Be A Busy Year For Phoenix-Area Freeway Projects

Drivers beware! The Arizona Department of Transportation will start as well as continue making progress on several Phoenix-area freeway construction or maintenance projects during 2024.

The New Year will see the launch of two Loop 101 widening projects as well as advancements on improvement projects that are underway along Interstate 10 near the Broadway Curve and along Interstate 17 north of Phoenix.

The following are among the major freeway projects ADOT will work on in 2024:

Loop 101 (Pima Freeway) Improvement Project between Shea Boulevard and Princess Drive/Pima Road in Scottsdale. The project is scheduled to start on Jan. 5 and include the addition of a lane in each direction within a 4.5-mile work zone. Crews also will convert the Loop 101 interchange at Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard into a diamond configuration to improve traffic flow. The project is scheduled to be completed in approximately two years. More information: azdot.gov/Loop101PrincessToShea

Loop 101 (Agua Fria Freeway) Improvement Project between I-17 and 75th Avenue in the northwest Valley. The two-year project is scheduled to start in fall 2024 and include the addition of a lane in each direction. Other work will include interchange and cross-street improvements at 75th Avenue. More information: azdot.gov/Loop101West75thToi17

I-10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project between the I-17 "Split" and Loop 202 in Chandler. The largest freeway reconstruction project in ADOT's history started in fall 2021 and is slated for completion near the end of 2024. Crews will finish elevated ramps providing direct connections between I-10 and State Route 143 (Hohokam Expressway) and complete lanes carrying local traffic in areas between Baseline Road and 40th Street. The project improves travel on 11 miles of one of the Valley's busiest stretches of freeway. More information: i10broadwaycurve.com

I-17 Improvement Project between Anthem Way and Sunset Point north of Phoenix. Work on the 23-mile project started in fall 2022. Crews are adding third lanes in each direction between Anthem Way and

Black Canyon City as well as a unique 8-mile flex lanes system north of Black Canyon City. Improvements are scheduled for completion by late 2025. More information: improvingi17.com

I-10 Gila River Bridges Project southeast of Riggs Road. The project, which will reconstruct the outdated existing I-10 bridges crossing the Gila River, is scheduled to start in spring 2024 and take approximately two years to complete.

I-17 Resurfacing Project between Happy Valley Road and State Route 74 in north Phoenix. A project to improve pavement conditions along I-17 is scheduled to start in spring 2024 and take approximately seven months to complete.
