SICK CALL

Your Editor, among other jobs, was taken very ill early March. My gall bladder was clogged with some stones and the bile tube was blocked. This caused an infection that destroyed the gall bladder

itself. I had no symptoms of this happening other that I had no appetite. Concurrently, I developed a few polyps in my stomach, one of which bled causing the hated black stool. Went to Abrazo Emergency room and they took me by ambulance to the Abrazo hospital in Arrowhead. They operated next evening, had to wait until I was loaded with antibiotics, and removed what was left of my gall bladder, Normally this is a one-hour surgery, in my case it took four. Next day they went down my throat and removed the stomach polyps. They kept me in the hospital a week. At home, I could barely get out of bed for two weeks. I lost 25 lbs. and I hope to keep it off. That is why there was no April Newsletter. I thank Karen for taking great care of me.




