FROM THE FIRST VICE-COMMANDER



The Importance of Being the One

On Memorial Day Rod Hage and I were participating in a fund raiser at the Lowe's store at Lake Pleasant and

Happy Valley Rd in Peoria for DAV Star 24. (It should come as no surprise to anyone that many American Legion members also belong to other veteran service organizations.) The Lowe's store had set up a nice memorial display in the parking lot near the entrance. While we were there, we noticed a Lowe's employee stop by the memorial stand there and then kneel for a while with his head bowed. He was a younger man, probably late twenties and as he stood up, we could see he was weeping and in emotional pain. We left our fund raising, approached him and with his permission hugged him. He said, "We lost too many brothers." We talked with him and learned he is a Marine who had been deployed to the Middle East a couple times and had watched some of his fellow Marines suffer wounds and death. As we comforted him, we also learned that he was on VA disability for PTSD. We also learned that he had a fellow veteran roommate who wasn't very sympathetic to his suffering. We helped him through his hard time, and he went back to work.

At this time, this young Marine probably wasn't suicidal, but he was suffering. Being the One is much more than just being there when someone is contemplating suicide. Being the One is being there for each other. Being there when our brother or sister is in pain, whether physical or psychological, and offering support and guidance. Being the One is also educating one another that PTSD and other mental health problems are just as real as physical injuries, so our brothers and sisters don't act without compassion as this Marine's roommate. Our support may be as simple as letting someone know you care, or it may be more involved such as referring them to someone else that can help more then we can. Helping may be convincing a fellow veteran that asking for help is not weakness. Remember 988 then press 1 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is always available to help those in mental distress. Another way you can help is by being informed. American Legion offers a free 90-minute zoom class, "Columbia Protocol" which will educate you on signs that someone is suffering mental distress and may need suicide prevention help. I encourage all to take this class. We may never eliminate veteran suicide, but we may be able to lower the rate of it.

Let us show each other we care. BE THE ONE!

ocean and beach any day! I used to live in the mountains, but it's been a while and I forgot how hot the sun is at this altitude, but it doesn't compare to the heat of our wonderful city of Surprise, in the summer.

I left Surprise for Vail on the day the weather report said it would be 114° F and I'm glad I did but feel for all of you still in the heat, so I wanted to provide some reminders of staying safe in the heat.

1. If you are out and about, remember there are Heat Relief Sites throughout Maricopa County from May 1 - September 30. Look for this sign...



- 2. Carry around water with you and stay hydrated.
- 3. Wear appropriate lightweight, light-color, and loose-fitting clothing.
- 4. Wear a hat or carry an umbrella.
- 5. Apply sunscreen, at least, 30 minutes prior to going out.
- 6. When you know it is going to be a very hot day, choose to stay indoors with air conditioning as much as possible.
- 7. Check on your family, friends, and neighbors to be sure they are keeping cool.

I wanted to share the Heat Relief Sites Map with you but there are 256 locations! You can Google 2024 Heat Relief Network and it will bring up the map or go to https://hrn.azmag.gov and search by address,

city, or zip code for all you need to keep cool in this blistering heat.

American Legion Riders Report



The Riders of American Legion Post 96 like to focus on two things in order of importance: Safety #1 and Recruiting #2.

Having witnessed a near fatal motorcycle crash recently during a

fundraiser for another motorcycle accident victim, thought it appropriate to post these facts and to remind us all to focus on motorcycle safety. There has been a string of serious motorcycle accidents in our area recently.



6,218 motorcyclists were killed in traffic crashes in 2022, which represents 15% of all traffic fatalities.

The fatality rate for motorcyclists was 22 times more than the passenger car occupant fatality rate in 2022, per 100 million vehicle miles traveled.

35% of all motorcycle riders involved in fatal crashes in 2022 were speeding, compared to 22% of all passenger

car drivers. Motorcycle riders 21 to 24 years old involved in fatal crashes had the highest speeding involvement at 51% in 2022.

Of the 2,254 motorcycle riders who died in single-vehicle crashes in 2022, 42% were alcohol-impaired.

Motorcycle helmet use increased among motorcycle riders from 64.9% in 2021 to 66.5% in 2022. Similarly, among motorcycle riders with passengers, helmet use increased: 52.1% in 2021 and 58.3% in 2022.

We continue to keep our eyes open for good servant leadership potential members to join our Riders group. Riders who want to help and serve, and have some fun as well.

The Meaning Behind the 13 Folds of Old Glory

What is the Meaning Behind the 13 Folds of the U.S. Flag?

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which the United States was originally founded.

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is Him we turn to in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country. In the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood. It has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that has molded the character of the men and women who have made this country great.

The tenth fold is a tribute to father, who has also given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born.

The eleventh fold represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The twelfth fold represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

The thirteenth and last fold, when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

What Happens After the Flag Folding Ceremony?

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under Gen. George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under Capt. John Paul Jones and were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the U.S. Armed Forces, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

The source and the date of origin of this Flag Folding Procedure is unknown. However, some sources attribute it to the Gold Star Mothers of America while others to an Air Force chaplain stationed at the United States Air Force Academy. Some sources also indicate that the 13 folds are a nod to the original first 13 colonies.


