Last month my article included one I wrote as Director of San Jose Harley Owners Group (SJHOG). I will include here some of what I wrote in April 2005:

Last month I was approached about a subject that we heard about in the news-Identity Theft. common version of Identity Theft is when someone acquires information about you such as SSN, birthday, birthplace, bank account, and so on. What I was asked is a different type; someone stole his license plate from his motorcycle. I have heard of this happening with cars, and this was the first about motorcycles. How can this be identity theft? Think about your license plate being used on a stolen motorcycle. Think further about that bike being used in crimes. If your license plate is suspected of a crime, then you can imagine how hard it can be to clear yourself. We all know how public attitude is toward motorcycle enthusiasts (a.k.a. bikers). An answer to this is to report the theft as soon as possible. Don't delay.

Safety is number one for all riders. If it is rainy most would prefer not to ride. But if you are caught in it, then it is different. Keeping rain gear with you during this time of year is good practice. Riding at a slower pace is required. Hot weather is coming too. Hydration, Hydration. Did I mention that you need to keep yourself hydrated? If it is very hot, 100+ degrees, you need to stop more often and get yourself cooled down. When you stop for gas, make sure it is a place where there is air conditioning inside (either the gas station or a restaurant). Gatorade or something like it, with water, should be your drinks of the day. When you sweat, your electrolytes are diminished, and they need replacing. Sodas or alcohol do not help. Be safe out there.

Remember

Memorial Day is one of the federal holidays in the United States for honoring, mourning and remembering the U.S. military personnel who died

while serving in the United States Armed Forces. It is observed on the last Monday of May. Many locations claim to be the first in the United States to observe Memorial Day by decorating the graves of fallen soldiers after the Civil War. The day was first called Decoration Day. The first large observance of Decoration Day was held on May 30th, 1868, at



Arlington **National** Cemetery, across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C. Maj. Gen. John A. Logan gave orders for his posts to decorate graves in 1868 "with the choicest flowers of springtime" urged: "We should guard their graves

with sacred vigilance. ... Let pleasant paths invite the coming and going of reverent visitors and fond mourners. Let no neglect, no ravages of time, testify to the present or to the coming generations that we

have forgotten as a people the cost of a free and undivided republic." The crowd attending the first Memorial Day ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery was approximately the same size as those that attend today's observance, about 5,000 people. Then, as



now, small American flags were placed on each grave — a tradition followed at many national cemeteries today. (* Source: U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs- Celebrating America's Freedoms.)

This Memorial Day weekend Post 96 will continue to remember the fallen warriors of America by



participating in two Memorial ceremonies. On Saturday, May 24, Post 96 will be joined by DAV Star Chapter 24 at the location of Fighters Field, AKA Luke Auxiliary Field 3 which was located in the area behind the library at Surprise Park. The area where the park

Surprise City Hall now stand was once a WWII pilot training field for those destined to fight in the war. Please join us there to honor those who trained there, many of whom never returned home. Details are in the flyer in this newsletter.

May Calendar

May is National Military Appreciation Month, is a month-long observance in the United States, dedicated to people who are currently serving in the United States military.

Thursday May 1 – 1600 Post 96 Officers meeting at Mike Elliott's home.

Thursday May 1 – National Day of Prayer - The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation.

May 2, 2011 - U.S. Special Operations Forces killed Osama bin Laden during a raid on his secret compound in Abbottabad, Pakistan. The raid marked the culmination of a decade-long manhunt for the elusive leader of the al-Qaeda terrorist organization based in the Middle East. Bin Laden had ordered the coordinated aerial attacks of September 11, 2001, in which four American passenger jets were hijacked then crashed, killing nearly 3,000 persons. Two jets had struck and subsequently collapsed the 110-story Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York, while another struck the Pentagon building in Washington, D.C. A fourth jet also headed toward Washington had crashed into a field in Pennsylvania as passengers attempted to overpower the hijackers on board.

May 5 - Celebrated in Mexico as Cinco de Mayo, a national holiday in remembrance of the Battle of Puebla in 1862, in which Mexican troops under General Ignacio

Zaragoza, outnumbered three to one, defeated the invading French forces of Napoleon III.

May 7, 1915 - The British passenger ship *Lusitania* was torpedoed by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland, losing 1,198 of its 1,924 passengers, including 114 Americans. The attack hastened neutral America's entry into World War I.

May 7, 1945 - In a small red brick schoolhouse in Reims, Germany, General Alfred Jodl signed the unconditional surrender of all German fighting forces thus ending World War II in Europe. Russian, American, British and French ranking officers observed the signing of the document which became effective at one minute past midnight on May 9. Jodl was then ushered in to see Supreme Allied Commander, General Dwight D. Eisenhower, who curtly asked Jodl if he fully understood the document. Eisenhower then informed Jodl that he would be held personally responsible for any deviation from the terms of the surrender. Jodl was then ushered away.

May 7, 1954 - The French Indochina War ended with the fall of Dien Bien Phu, in a stunning victory by the Vietnamese over French colonial forces in northern Vietnam. The country was then in divided in half at the 17th parallel, with South Vietnam created in 1955.

May 7, 1992 - The 27th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, prohibiting Congress from giving itself pay raises.

May 10, 1869 - The newly constructed tracks of the Union Pacific and Central Pacific railways were first linked at Promontory Point, Utah. A golden spike was driven by Leland Stanford, president of the Central Pacific, to celebrate the linkage. It is said that he missed the spike on his first swing which brought roars of laughter from men who had driven thousands upon thousands of spikes themselves.

Sunday May 11 – **Mother's Day** is an annual holiday celebrated in the United States on the second Sunday in May. Mother's Day recognizes mothers, motherhood and maternal bonds in general, as well as their positive contributions to their families and society. It was established by Anna Jarvis, with the first official Mother's Day celebrated through a service of worship at St.

Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia, on May 10, 1908.

May 13, 1846 - At the request of President <u>James K. Polk</u>, Congress declared war on Mexico. The controversial struggle eventually cost the lives of 11,300 U.S. soldiers and resulted in the annexation of lands that became parts of Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Utah and Colorado. The war ended in 1848 with the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo.

May 14, 1942 - During World War II, an Act of Congress allowed women to enlist for noncombat duties in the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps (WAAC), the Women Appointed for Voluntary Emergency Service (WAVES), Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS), and Semper Paratus Always Ready Service (SPARS), the Women's Reserve of the Marine Corp.

May 18, 1998 - In one of the biggest antitrust lawsuits of the 20th century, American software giant Microsoft Corporation was sued by the U.S. Federal government and 20 state governments charging the company with using unfair tactics to crush competition and restrict choices for consumers. The lawsuits alleged Microsoft used illegal practices to deny personal computer owners the benefits of a free and competitive market and also alleged Microsoft extended its monopoly on operating systems to "develop a chokehold" on the Internet browser software market.

May 20, 1927 - Charles Lindbergh, a 25-year-old aviator, took off at 7:52 a.m. from Roosevelt Field, Long Island, in the *Spirit of St. Louis* attempting to win a \$25,000 prize for the first solo nonstop flight between New York City and Paris. Thirty-three hours later, after a 3,600 mile journey, he landed at Le Bourget, Paris, earning the nickname "Lucky Lindy" and becoming an instant worldwide hero.

May 31, 1889 - Over 2,300 persons were killed in the Johnstown flood in Pennsylvania. Heavy rains throughout May caused the Connemaugh River Dam to burst sending a wall of water 75 feet high pouring down upon the city.


